### **Students Remembering at UWO**

LONDON, ON: The University Students' Council will be hosting a Remembrance Day ceremony on Tuesday, November 11<sup>th</sup> at 11am in the University Community Centre (UCC) atrium. This year's ceremony will focus on connecting current students with the life and times of war. This will include depictions of many different aspects of the war such as the culture of recruitment in the daily newspaper, classroom cancellations, and women's roles. The ceremony will run for approximately 45 minutes.

"We took a unique approach to creating our Remembrance Day ceremony this year," said Cara Eng, Vice-President Campus Issues for the University Students' Council. "We really want the students to be able to understand how different the lives of students during the war were."

Students will be performing pieces from various wars (WW1, WW2, Korean War, Vietnam War) as well as their own compositions. A collection of historic videos, images, and articles from past UWO students and archives will be playing during this ceremony. Guest presenters will include a member of the Alumni Association who will be presenting a plaque in memory of the students that participated in WW1, as well as Stephen Lecce, USC President, who will be making a short speech.

All members of the university and the London Community are welcome to attend this Remembrance Day ceremony.
